President's Report — Bob Bedoll We are in the golden age of AIHS

- Facilities: Our incredible facilities have become a focal point for community events and classes.
- Events/Classes: almost 250 classes and events this year, including 150 recurring classes/events, plus almost 100 unique events. (in conjunction with Island Arts)
- Membership: 266 members, a new record.
- Salmon Bake Meals: served over 700 salmon & rib meals, the most ever.
- **Silent Auction**: raised over \$15,000, the most ever.
- Visitors: 1,238, the most ever.
- Fundraising Events: Farm Day, Salmon Bake, Apple Squeeze, raised over \$30K, a new record.
- Events: Added a new annual event: Juneteenth (in conjunction with Island Arts)
- Financial: Over \$180K in reserve, and we'll continue to invest in our future through maintenance and capital improvements.
- Facilities: upgraded the farm buildings, grounds, new storage facility. Added New Greenhouse.
- **Displays**: upgraded our displays and collections.
- Visitor Engagement: We keep the gift shop open every weekend from April, and the farmhouse and archival building open and staffed every weekend this summer.
- Videos: We produced a new documentary, "The Anderson Island Story", shown here and the AIFF, and upgraded our video on-line presence to 27 videos and 22 3-minute shorts.




- The AIHS is a vibrant organization dedicated to the history of Anderson Island.

 - An extensive and ever-growing collection of island artifacts and chronicles


COMMUNITY
