- **This was a challenging year for the AIHS**

- We were limited to only 2 potlucks and no summer events, and no summer gift shop.

- **The Bad News:**

- This limited our fund raising to only the Garden Market & Plant Sale, which was quite successful, bringing in over \$4,000, and a limited gift shop presence.
- The lack of a Salmon Bake and a robust gift shop left a \$20,000 hole in our fund raising.
- Fortunately some large one-time donations and a state grant filled that hole.

- **The Good News:**

- We are still in excellent financial condition.
- The “Johnson Farm Movie” was a big success and continues to win awards.
- We were still able to carry out our primary missions of Preservation, and to a lesser extent, Presentation.
- We upgraded farm buildings and grounds, and started construction on a new storage facility.
- We added high-quality items to our collection.
- We revamped to Gift Shop point-of-sale system, making checkout faster for customers and inventory control and book-keeping easier and more accurate for the staff.

 - Facilities for a wood shop, equipment repair area.
 - Storage for Historical Collection objects
 - Storage for Farm tools and equipment

- Timetable: Permitting began in early 2019. Kit Delivery in November 2019. Foundation in Summer 2020. Erection began in October 2020 with an all-volunteer crew, 3 half-days/week. Completion sometime 1H2021 (about 4 - 5 months flow-time).

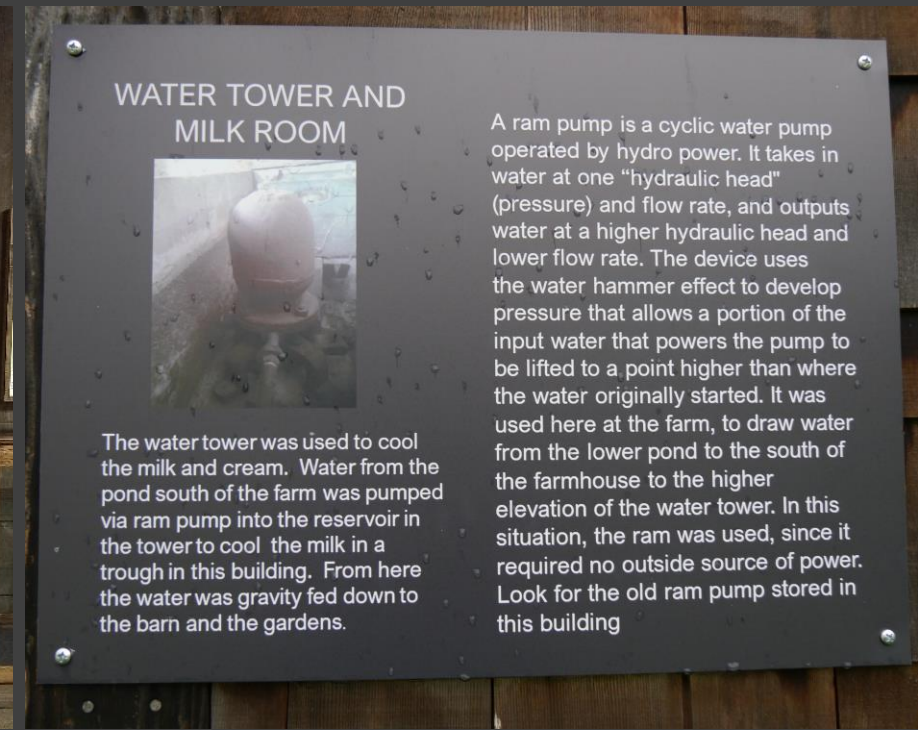

- A significant percentage of the Island population belongs to the organization (and many of them are under fifty).

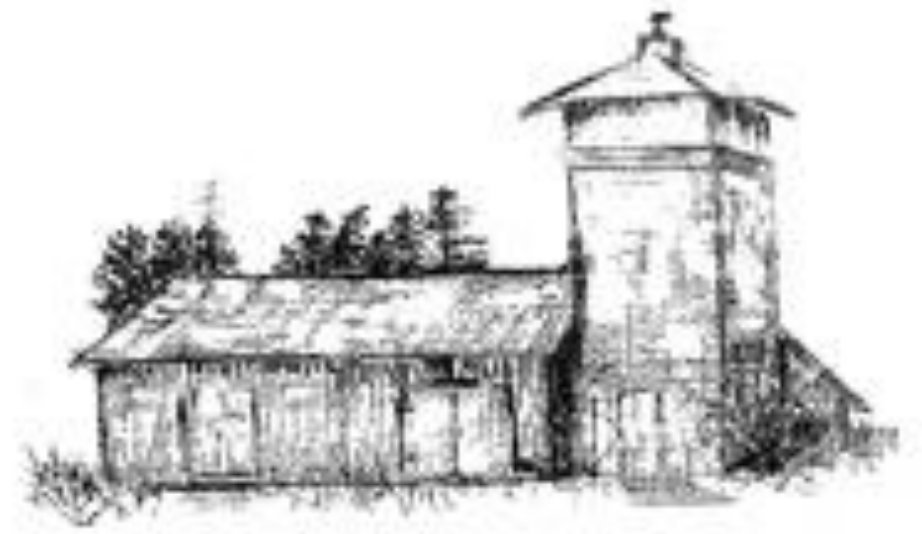

- An extensive and ever-growing collection of island artifacts and chronicles

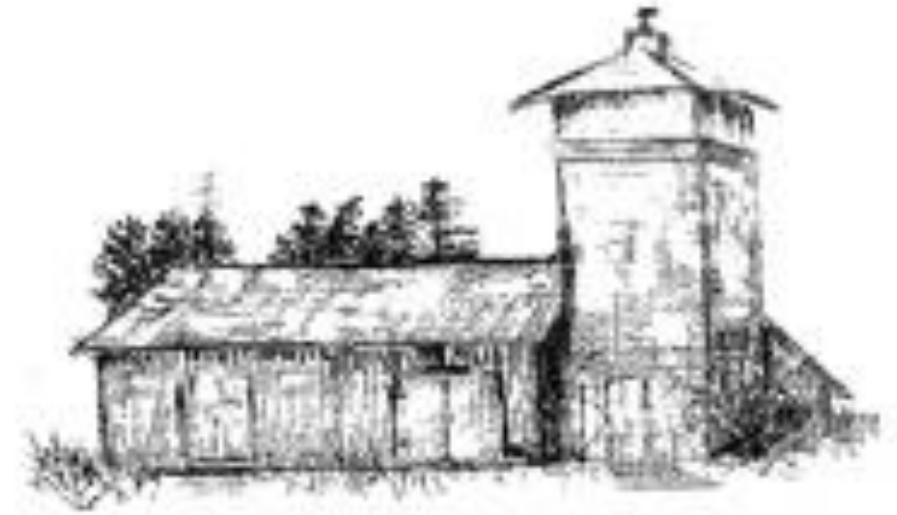
